

Snowflake

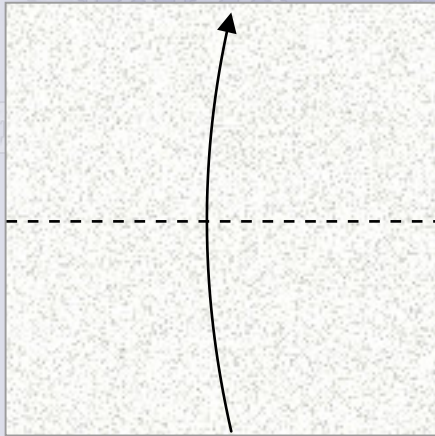

This is a traditional paper cutting method, in a form particularly suited for snowflakes.

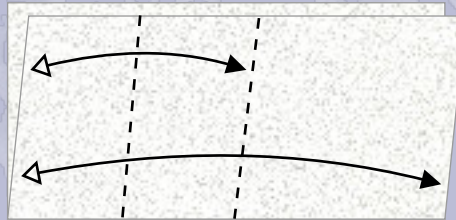
Try to cut "crystal like", using straight, parallel edges and polygonal points.

This time we use a square, but the method works just fine with A4 or letter format.

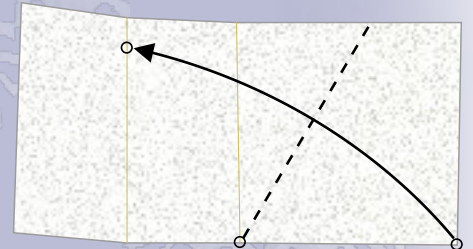
Snowflakes are unique, so make great variations.



1 Fold in half.



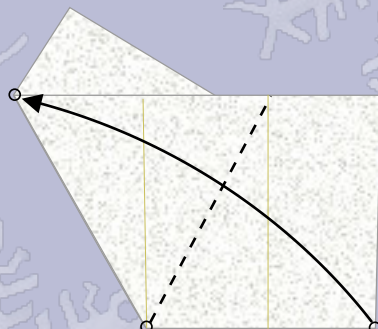
2 Make the half mark and a quarter mark.



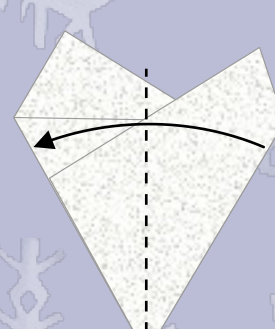
3 Fold the corner to the quarter mark. The crease must start where the half mark touches the folded edge.



4 Turn over.



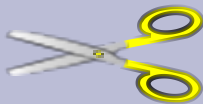
5 Fold the corner to align with the folded edge.



6 Fold in half.



7 Cut off excess paper.



8 Unfold carefully.

Cut out a pattern.

9 Finished snowflake
Press flat.
